

Road MAP to Success

AAUW Texas is introducing an exciting new award - the MAP Award. MAP stands for Membership, Advocacy, and Philanthropy. As we start the journey towards the 2018 AAUW Texas Convention inHouston, we encourage branches to MAP out their 2017-2018 year with theMAP Award as part of the plan.

The criteria is simple:

1. Membership: The branch can achieve an M for membership by either increasing membership by 5%, having a retention rate of 90%, or recruiting 3 new members.

2. Advocacy: The branch can achieve an A for advocacy by planning one mission-based program or event.

3. Philanthropy: The branch can achieve a P for Philanthropy by donating \$5 for each member to AAUW Funds.

All roads lead to the Houston AAUW Texas Convention where branches will be recognized for achieving MAP - membership, advocacy, and Philanthropy goals. A good plan is like a road MAP: it shows the final destination and usually the best way to get there. So, do not forget to include MAP in your planning for the next AAUW year. See you in Houston!

EQUAL PAY DAY

2017 Equal Pay Lobby Day was a success on both the state and national level. On Tuesday, April 4, 2017 we joined hundreds of Texas residents at the State Capitol lobbying for multiple causes. The day was truly invigorating and inspiring. In addition we hosted a Pre Lobby Day reception on Monday, April 3 hosted by Austin Branch, Co Public Policy Chair Jean Bessent. The event highlighted an Austin based employment & labor law attorney and owner of a FMLA firm.

On April 4 women joined us across the state at the Texas State Capitol for an informative day and an opportunity to stand together in solidarity for women. We were thrilled to have the UT Austin student chapter Co-President, Kavya Ramamoorthy share her perspective on equal pay and UT Austin's commitment to inform and educate young about equal pay through our Start Smart, Work Smart, Salary Negotiation workshops. In addition Traci Jensen, AAUW Director and Texas VP of Funds shared her personal perspective on the importance of equal pay and current AAUW Public Policies. We appreciated Texas State Representative Ina Minjarez sponsoring us and sharing details about her bill HB 656 relating to family leave for women. Special thank you to our Branch Public Policy Chairs.

HB 290 did make it out of the Business and Industry Committee; however, it did not make it on the House Calendar. Both HB937 and HB 656 died while still in committee.

2017 Equal Pay Lobby Day was a success on both the state and national level, but as you know, the fight is not finished. Our next Lobby Day will probably be April 2019. However, wouldn't it be great it the Day that Women make the same amount of money as Men was moved up a couple of months?

What is next?

As we all know, only 55% of the registered voters voted in the Fall 2016 Presidential election. AAUW is a non-partisan organization. How can we help increase the number of voters in the 2018 Elections? Not only can we help in voter registration efforts beginning now, but we can start planning election events in our Branches during the Spring and Fall of 2018.

Candace does not live in Denton (she teaches at Mt. Holyoke in Massachusetts). She is a phenomenal scholar. Her work took place in 5 national parks. She lived in each for an extended period of time, took amazing photos while also working with the rangers. She then created movement solos inspired by the landscape, history, and sense of each. She based her ideas in differing movement philosophies discussing how knowledge is created in the moving body's relationship with the environment.
