# Thinking Toward the Future: Challenges and Opportunities

The 2007 AAUW Leadership Conference, "Leaders Envisioning the Future" will be held at the Clarion Inn & Suites Conference Center in Austin, 2200 IH-35 South, Austin, 78704-4436, July 21-22. A registration form and complete program schedule is included in this UWT! Addendum. All branches receive one free registration for their president or her designated representative. Other branch members will pay a minimal amount of \$120 for two days of programming, one night's lodging, three meals, and a resource compact disc.

"New branch officers, as well as members who envision a future leadership role in AAUW—either at local, state or national levels-- should plan to attend," said AAUW Texas program vice president Lane Powell of Lubbock. "The program will include several new features as well as outstanding keynote speakers who will guide our thinking toward future challenges and opportunities. We have kept the cost low to encourage attendance. Space is limited, however, so don't be late in submitting your registration. There is also a cutoff date of June 30. After that a late registration fee of \$25 will be added." The conference room rate (\$89 plus tax) is available for those who wish to come on Friday night. 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## Program Review Saturday July 21

#### PLENARY I

Futurist and former IBM executive Terry Grim will keynote the first plenary with a speech entitled "Bagged Lettuce?? Or How to Repackage for New Opportunities. "As we look around us, we see a burst of exciting innovative ideas and products. Learning how to view trends and demographics provides insight and guidance as to how we might reframe our own potential opportunities," said Ms. Grim, who has a Masters degree in Futures Research from the University of Houston.

**LUNCH** will offer a chance to meet and talk with officer counterparts and state board members.

#### PILOT PROGRAM

The afternoon begins with a special pilot program "Financially Fit for Life," which is being developed by Prudential Insurance and AAUW.

#### WEBSITES

A "virtual tour" of the internet resources available to members will follow. Board member *Liz Stepp* will walk us through the websites and show everyone how easy they are to access.

Membership chair Priscilla Mowinkel will illustrate how to access and use the online membership data base.

#### **BREAKOUT SESSIONS**

Breakout sessions will conclude the afternoon program. Participants are asked to choose between three options.

**OPTION ONE** is a **documentary film** (*"Iron Jawed Angels"*) depicting women's historical struggles for equality and AAUW's role in making change happen.

**OPTION TWO** is a **workshop** AAUW's priority issues on Capitol Hill: Education, Economic Security and Public Policy led by Lisa Maatz, the Association Director of Public Policy.

**THIRD OPTION** is a series of **Roundtable Discussions** which are listed on the program page. Roundtable discussions allow a person to choose three table topics within the 1 ½ hours. Each discussion lasts 30 minutes, and then the participants move to the next table of their choice. "This format allows persons to share new information and interact with each other," explained Powell. "And it gives us a chance to offer more options in the time allotted."

Responding to the request for more time to visit and browse, the **dinner by districts** will encourage branches in the same district to meet each other and to meet their district rep. This will be followed by a reception and more time to browse the **resource and exhibit tables**.

JULY 22-SUNDAY- PLENARY III "POSITIVE PR"-
