Holiday Book Collection 2015



For several years AAUW Dallas has participated in a **Holiday collection** to provide new or gently used books for children in the two elementary schools in the Vickery Meadow area.

Research shows that children who are just beginning to read often lose reading skills during the breaks around the holidays, but are more likely to read during school holidays if they have the opportunity to choose their own books and to keep the books. The Vickery Meadow Youth Development Foundation is collecting books to provide a buffet of books from which 2nd and 3rd grade children at McShan and Lowe Elementary Schools may select two books each for the two weeks of winter break.

The books we are looking for may be gently used or new. Reading skills of the children vary greatly and so the difficulty of the books could be from kindergarten to fifth grade levels.

Both schools are located in the Vickery Meadow area which is in northeast Dallas where Greenville Avenue and Park Lane intersect. The schools report that 98% of the students are on free or reduced lunch. McShan has counted 27 languages spoken in the school. In surveying the families, many reported not having any books in the home.

Books brought to the November or December AAUW meetings will be delivered to the Foundation office before the deadline.

UN 70 Strong: celebrating the 70th anniversary of the United Nations

New Film: Suffragette

This year we celebrate the 95th Anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment that gained women the right to vote in 1920. The film, *Suffragette*, will be released on Friday, October 23, starring Carey Mulligan, Helena Bonham Carter, Brendan Gleeson, Anne-Marie Duff. Ben Whishaw, Romola Garai and Meryl Streep. The dramatic film tracks the story of the foot soldiers of the early feminist movement, women who were forced underground to pursue a dangerous game of cat and mouse with an increasingly brutal State. These women were not primarily from the genteel educated classes, they were

working women who had seen peaceful protest achieve nothing.
