AAUW Membership Categories and 2024-2025 Dues

- 1) <u>Regular Members</u>. Any woman or man who holds an associate (or equivalent, e.g., RN), bachelor's, or higher degree from an accredited college or university is eligible for membership. To join, an individual pays combined national AAUW, state, and local dues: 2024-2025 national AAUW dues are \$72 (as of January 2024, all national dues are fully tax deductible) and AAUW Texas dues are \$13; local branch dues vary in amount. These members are also referred to as "Individual Members" or "National Members."
- 2) <u>Dual Members</u>. Some members belong to more than one branch. Dual members pay national AAUW, state, and local dues in their primary branch, and local dues to the secondary branch(es). If the branches are in different states, they also pay state dues to the secondary branch.
- 3) <u>Paid Life Members</u>. Paid Life members of national AAUW pay a a one-time payment of \$1,440, which is fully tax deductible. Paid Life members pay only state and local dues annually.
- 4) <u>Honorary Life or 50-Year Members</u>. Anyone who has been a member of national AAUW for 50 years is eligible for Honorary Life membership. Honorary Life members do not pay national AAUW dues or AAUW Texas dues, and many branches also waive local dues. Click here for the <u>APPLICATION FOR HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP (aauw.net)</u> form.
- 5) <u>Graduate Students</u> seeking a degree may join AAUW and pay reduced national AAUW dues of \$18.81 (of which 16.81 is tax deductible) and AAUW Texas dues of \$1. Branches decide if students should pay local dues and the amount.
- 6) <u>Student Associates</u>. Undergraduate students enrolled in an accredited two-or four-year college or university may associate with AAUW. They pay reduced national AAUW dues of \$18.81, of which \$16.81 is tax deductible, and AAUW Texas dues of \$1. Branches decide if students should pay local dues and the amount.

NOTE: Undergraduates/Graduates attending AAUW College/University member schools may join nationally for free. Visit www.aauw.org and search e-student.

- 7) **National Only Members (Members-at-Large).** Members who have only joined national AAUW pay national dues of \$72. They are also eligible to become members of AAUW Texas by paying \$13, with no branch affiliation, as there are not local branches everywhere in the state.
- 8) <u>College/University Members</u>. Colleges and universities can join AAUW as an institution by paying annual dues of \$250. The college is eligible to have two representatives that pay no national AAUW dues. In order to become a member of a local branch, these representatives must pay state and local dues.
